On Wednesday 10th October 2007 an educational visit to The Somerset Rural Life Museum in Glastonbury has been organised for Miss Hendry's class.

The children will be exploring what it was like for rural farming communities during the Victorian Period. During the visit they will have an opportunity to handle artefacts and take part in a cooking activity. The children should come dressed in their school uniform. The museum has requested that the girls wear a skirt or dress, as they will be dressed as Victorian girls as part of the visit.

The visit will take place during school hours and we will be having a picnic lunch.
